FINANCIAL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Mesa Grande Academy's Board attempts to keep the school tuition and other charges as low as is consistent with good fiscal management. Tuition payments do not cover the full operating cost for MGA and is therefore subsidized by the members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. The MGA Board reserves the right to adjust charges for tuition and fees at second semester should unstable economic conditions warrant such adjustments. The following financial policies have been adopted by the Board:

- ◆ All outstanding school accounts, at MGA or other SDA schools, must be settled prior to registration.
- ◆ MGA will not prorate tuition for late registrants or prolonged absences if the student receives full academic credit for work completed. Tuition will be prorated for students registering or withdrawing in the middle of the year.
- ◆ When a student withdraws from school, a parent or responsible party must file a *Withdrawal from School* form with the administrative office. Tuition is prorated from the date indicated on the *Withdrawal from school form*.
- If an account becomes 60 days past due, we will ask that the student withdraw from school until the amount is paid in full or satisfactory financial arrangements are made with the business office.
- All accounts held by a family, current and past, will be considered for registration and for issuance of financial clearance to take exams. Cash or a money order may be required for payment on delinquent accounts. Students must have a current balance by the end of the 3rd quarter in order to take year-end finals and participate in graduation exercises. Accounts must be paid in full to receive diplomas.
- A 10% tuition discount will be given to new students and a 10% tuition discount will be given to the current family that referred them. The referring family's name must appear on the new student's application form when submitted.

- ◆ All payments are due by the 25th of the month. Accounts 60 days delinquent in excess of \$100.00 will incur a service charge of \$10.00 per month.
- ◆ If a check is returned for any reason, a fee of \$25.00 will be charged. A history of checks returned for insufficient funds may result in a request for payments to be made in cash or money order.
- ◆ Financial clearance is required before students are allowed to take overnight trips.
- ◆ Charges for some additional school activities may be billed to your account provided your account is current. Non-current accounts will require upfront cash payments for participation. These charges may include: Class or Field Trips (Choir or Biology), Meal Tickets, Used Textbooks or Uniforms, Varsity, etc...
- ◆ MGA does not accept second party Checks.
- ◆ Class dues are non-refundable.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Please contact your local church education representative regarding tuition assistance or the Southeastern California Conference Office of Education for application and/or information on the Pacific Union Endowment Fund, Conference Low Income Scholarship or Conference Ethnic Scholarship. Additional tuition scholarships may be available.

EDUCATIONAL SUBSIDY

If your employer offers educational subsidies for your child, you must apply at your place of employment and submit the signed authorization to the Business Office. Accounts will be credited after payments are received from your employer. Responsible parties should continue to make full payments on accounts until the Business Office has received the allowance.

ON-TIME DISCOUNT

A discount of \$5 per student will be given when the account is paid in full by the 15th of the month.
